During the summer of 2020, an online survey was administered to **METHODS**

graduate students who had received Basic Needs services at seven University of California campuses. Respondents reported COVID-19 exposures and infections, COVID-19 impacts on work, basic needs (food and housing) and academics, and campus Basic Needs service utilization. The following infographics pertain to COVID-19 impacts on graduate students' basic needs.


